each member to review it carefully for both the obvious and the not so obvious errors, but also for inconsistencies or mistakes that we may have made in failing to pick up corrections made, and this is particularly important for the Chairman of each committee to review their particular parts very carefully with the reporters, so that we can at least be sure that the draft that we are now circulating or will be circulating is accurate.

To save us time, please don't delay this and then write letters. Get on the telephone, if you find any corrections, and dictate to John or to me or our secretaries whatever you have, so we can make the changes right away.

As you know, we have had talks at great length throughout the course of the Commission meetings about the schedule to be attached, but we have never really come to grips with it until the Committee on the Judiciary Department attempted to work out a schedule with reference to their article. We were thinking that that committee might be sort of the guinea pig for the Commission in the schedule because, perhaps, there are
