it's constant, maybe for two or three hours. It's just been one after the other. But, by and large, the calls are coming from, I would say, pretty much the same type of group. These are from people who have long been interested in government, such as members of the League of Women Voters who have very strong feelings on this and expressed them not just through one person, but through many persons. Also, other groups, young people, which just formed and organized in the last election and haven't any long political experience, but are very much interested in the whole subject of constitutional revision. Some of them are swinging way over to the other extreme. They want an entirely different districting, so that you would have no more than one delegate from any district. In other words, that the distribution be chopped down to the size of just one delegate.

I would say that reaction in Baltimore City, and this is due to some misunderstanding of the previous recommendation of the Commission and some feeling that we were recommending citywide election of delegates, was one of shock and horror at the idea of electing 43
