us do the difficulties, the other considerations and
says quite frankly that it's certainly not a black and
white proposition.

As to the method of trying to secure the election, he made a number of suggestions, most of which are discarded, including things such as maybe we ought to give consideration to some method of nomination, not by another election, but by a commission or committees officially appointed, perhaps selected by the Legislature, perhaps by combined action of the Executive and the Legislature; some method to try to reduce the total number of candidates in the general special election.

He recognized, of course, that this would pose terrific problems, if you tried to get the Legislature to by a joint resolution name la state-wide or region or county nominating commission, you would have all sorts of problems, but he threw it out not as a recommendation, but merely as something to think of to illustrate his thought that if you could work out some machinery to narrow down the numbers, it would be helpful.
