County again as an illustration, if you have the League of Women Voters active, the various civil clubs, the Lions, Rotary, Kiwanis, the Young Democrats, the Young Republicans; all of these groups, each one of them are going to have numerous members who are going to be candidates and, for instance, we have had numerous members of the League of Women Voters tell us definitely they are going to be candidates.

This means to get them to agree on a relatively small slate for any particular county is going to be awfully difficult. This is a problem of organization.

I think that about covers, in general, the things we discussed, doesn't it, John?

MR. BROOKS: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?

MR. BOND: Mr. Chairman, I was on the losing side of this bruising debate that Mr. Scanlan talked about and I would just like to make a couple of comments on what Al said and also on what the Chairman said.
