conversely, on the other side, in the concentrated area of Wheaton and Silver Spring, eight Republicans went down and this is the kind of situation we would be confronted with in Montgomery County, we think, if we had to elect our delegates to the Constitutional Convention. There might be some very attractive fellows over in Silver Spring that wouldn't have a chance if we couldn't put together a county-wide situation. Conversely, there would be some attractive people in Potomac you would like to have that wouldn't have a chance if the pattern of the last election was followed.

So, I think in Montgomery, on balance, with people who really understand the situation and looked at it would favor the at-large business.

Believe me, my views on this were formed before we had these results.

THE CHAIRMAN: I might add this comment, if I can remember how it was expressed to me, kind of humorously, indicating somewhat the contrary view to that. Somebody who said, as I remember it, Bethesda
