popular delegates. This is a matter that is really snow-balling. We had a great number of organizations who indicated they have been moving in this direction.

DR. BURDETTE: Mr. Chairman, I would like to invite, with your permission, Mr. Scanlan to give an estimate of a device that bears on this point, which turned up in Montgomery County with reference to the election of the School Board. I say this because I think Mr. Scanlan is a more active engager in political affairs than I, as an observer, although a fellow resident of Montgomery County. Maybe the members of the Commission are not aware that in Montgomery County, with the only elective School Board in the state, that for the choice of four members this year a county convention was called under the auspices of a committee which has existed for sometime on public schools and persons who were interested in being endorsed by that group were asked to come to appear before it.

The decision may have been made in the committee, this I do not know, but in any event, it was ostensibly made by the presence of the good many persons
