THE CHAIRMAN: Contrary?

MR. EROOKS: One.

THE CHAIRMAN: The motion is carried fourteen to one. Now, Dr. Bard, you wanted to comment.

DR. BARD: I would like to offer one additional point that has not been stated so far. In

additional point that has not been stated so far. In addition to the fact that the ballot would be unwieldy, in addition to the fact that district voting would be more democratic, I would like to submit a point and first two questions that needn't be answered at the moment.

Which counties were finally required to set up districts when reapportionment took place? That is the first question. I know that Montgomery. Prince Georges, Baltimere, Anne Arundel, I think one or two others which were in debate, but at least those.

The second question. Have we not said that we do not desire more than six representatives in any one district? As I remember, our our legislative department on this, this is the position we held with a good deal of strength.

Now, my point. There was a -- two points.

There were a good deal of debates in the General Assembly
