Mr. Bond?

we have more people here from Baltimore County than
any of the other counties that might be affected. Therefore, they are more sensitive to the particular problems
in that county. If the principle of districting is valid,
and I happen to favor that, then it seems to me it's
valid for all of the urban counties that are covered by
districts.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

MR. BOND: I agree with Dr. Jenkins, it's the principle of districting, of getting the vote close to the people should be valid for all the counties affected.

I am concerned by what Mr. Case said.

I've been thinking about this matter of nominations and in some sort of weeding out procedure, and I must confess off the top of my head reactions. One, that this could be the one thing that could bettle this bill up in the Legislature and cause more consternation and confusion and perhaps hold it up, on the battles as to how these nominating conventions would be constituted and
