MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, on this particular point, I think, my gosh, we have an awful lot of smart people on this committee and I can't see the wisdom of trying to limit the amount of people who would want to file. We're talking about a democratic administration.

I'm not talking about Democratic versus Republican.

I'm talking about a democratic system. We're a free government. Everyone has a right under our constitution, should have the right to file for any position they want.

If we start to limit/to caucusing or to how many people can run, you are just opening doors for a flood of cases in the courts.

Now, I think, if we want to try to get this thing moving in the direction we want, the nominations to the convention should be free to anyone who desires to file. It's going to be up to the people, the organizations interested in these particular nominations, to try to get the best people to be nominated, so they will be the convention delegates; but I think if we try to limit the amount of people who can run and the method, we're going to run into serious problems with the
