kind of nominating procedure or any other device that 2 would reduce the number of names on the ballot and whether it's wise to do so, and secondly, if not, to recommend a breaking point at which you go from district to county-5 wide elections. I don't think this should be just 6 arbitrarily the four counties. Maybe there is a different 7 breaking point. That's merely a suggestion. 8 MR. CASE: I'll make that motion. 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second? 10 11 DR. BARD: I second it. 12 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe? MRS, BOTHE: I don't want to re-open this 13 issue necessarily, but in view of the large number of 14 candidates there may be, I suggest that perhaps the 15 committee might reconsider that they are not even going 16 to be in alphabetical order, when you have to select 17 between a thousand odd names, if there are going to be 18 that many. 19 Still in there plugging. 20 MR.
