SCANLAN: We concluded, however desirable that might be, there was really no practical way we could work it out, especially within the press of time that faced us, and secondly, I think some of us felt that that particular policy wasn't a good thing. It may be that democracy is a very poor form of government, but as Churchill said, it's still the best devised, and we felt in the special election where powers spring from the people, any attempts to really curtail people from the right for standing for the office would be -- I think primarily it was a practical problem. There just wasn't time.

MR. CASE: Another question. Do you think then. as Chairman of the Committee, there would be any useful purpose served by referring this matter back to your Committee with the idea that some new judgment or different judgment could be made in this area?
