of which are obviously archaic or unnecessary, not be included in the new Constitution. The Sixth Report deals with, I believe it is six sections in the present Constitution, only one of which do we recommend retention. We will take them seriatim. Article I, Section 7, which appears on Page 1 of the report, is a provision which provides that if an elected or an appointed official refuses to take the oath as provided for in Article I, Section 6 -- and you may recall that in the second or third meeting of the Commission, way back, the Commission adopted a recommended oath for the new Constitution. It makes provision for what happens if someone refuses or fails to take it and for what happens if he does take it and then violates it.

There are similar provisions in other constitutions, but the Committee's unanimous view is that it is really not necessary to place one in the new Constitution of Maryland.

The matter has been judicially construed and it seems that even without a constitutional provision for office would be vacant in the absence -- if the individual
