MR. BROOKS: I know of no constitutional author-1 I think this is an inherent power of the legislature. 2 Whether or not there are some limitations in the constitution or not, I think they can add on to those any time they 5 like. THE CHAIRMAN: You mean the legislature could impose qualifications in addition to the constitutional 7 8 qualifications? MR. BROOKS: Yes, sir. 10 I question that. Dr. Michener? THE CHAIRMAN: 11 DR. MICHENER: This wouldn't necessarily be a problem. Of course, the legislature would be allowed to 12 remove an individual, and this is not a double jeopardy 13 provision, to remove him from office and he is still liable 14 to conviction. I imagine an impeachment proceeding would 15 not be subject to the Governor's pardon. 16 17 MR. BROOKS: It is explicitly not, in the pro-18 cedure on impeachment. MR. SCANLAN: I suppose the problem is largely 19 20 climinated by practical considerations. Governors don't

usually appoint people who have been convicted of bribery.

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
