Mr. Mencken suggested in his Constitution. For example, he made no mention of the election of the Comptroller.

He stated that the Attorney General should be appointed by the Governor.

MR. CASE: And then was immediately shot.

MR. MINDEL: This is very interesting. He said that the executive power of the Maryland Free State shall be vested in the Governor, whose term of office shall be continued ten years, or in case no successor lawfully qualifies at the end of this term until such successor qualifies. He also said that no one shall be eligible to the office of Governor, save one who was a natural born citizen of the Maryland Free State and has resided within its boundaries for the ten years immediately preceding his entrance into office.

He also said about the Attorney General, and interestingly enough this was mentioned, pardon and reprieve.

He said there shall be an Attorney General whose duty it shall be to advise the Governor, the Legislative

Council, which would be the Legislature, and incidentally, he favored the unicameral Legislature, and all
