election if we went by the subdistricts in the county.

Why do you say that? I don't MR. MELVIN: follow that.

MR. SCANLAN: In other words, with sixteen spots to fill, it is possible that all the civic groups, political parties in a particular county, could work out a slate that would be acceptable to all sides and be truly a nonpartisan slate,

On the other hand, as you reduce the number of people that can serve on the slate, it becomes progressively more difficult to make that type accommodation in the interest of nonpartisan elections.

In the Baltimore situation it was dealt with differently because it means you would be working out a slate of forty-three which is going too far in the other direction.

As I say, maybe at this time we could, would suggest we could put at this time that he must reside in the district or county from which he runs and leave aside at this time, postponé any definite Commission decision on whether or not it agrees with
