meeting was that this would not exclude from voting numerous persons who are confined as mental incompetents but have not been adjudicated.

MRS. BOTHE: The thing I object to is that here the Legislature has a free hand to decide what degree of criminal activity would exclude you but there is nothing to be said about what degree of mental incompetency was, and I would be satisfied if the Legislature could set up a degree or standard or a definition of mental incompetency just as it can for serious crime.

THE CHATRMAN: It seems to me the discussion indicates there may be a division in the Commission between those who think the definition of mental incompetency is sufficient to disqualify should be left to the Legislature, as Mrs. Bothe suggested, and those who think it should be in the Constitution. It may be desirable to take a vote to determine the sense of the Commission on that question and then move on from there. Let me pose the question there, therefore.
