disqualify those who are mentally incompetent but leave to the Legislature the procedure and the determination of who is a mental incompetent. Is there any discussion further of that question before we move on? Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: I would like to speak briefly to it: some of us who are serving on Mental Health Commissions recognize that there have been some radical changes in respect to the treatment, interpretation, how we feel about mental incompetents, and the whole element of whether one is institutionalized and how long he is institutionalized has changed radically in this regard and therefore I feel that leaving it to the Legislature has some advantage in that they could benefit from new interpretations as they are made. leaves the situation far more fluid than keeping it in the Constitution.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe?

MRS. BOTHE: I am not too sure what you have asked us to vote on, Mr. Chairman, whether it is in accordance with my remark or not, because the way I read the present wording of Section 4, it specifically
