by law exclude persons because of serious crime. It doesn't say anything about the General Assembly. It just uses the words mentally incompetent without any definition or any standard under the present wording.

All I was suggesting was if mentally incompetent people were to be excluded, and I think there are circumstances where they should be, that the Legislature before anybody was excludable would have to set up a definition or standard.

THE CHAIRMAN: That is what I intended to
put up with my question, that the Constitution, without
meaning to give the precise phraseology, the Constitution
would declare that anyone mentally incompetent was
ineligible to vote but specifically leave to the
Legislature to provide by law the mechanics for determining whether a person was mentally incompetent and
the standards for determining mental competency.

MRS. BOTHE: A vote in favor of that proposia tion would be/vote against Section 4?

THE CHAIRMAN: A vote against Section 4 to so
