THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. I am only suggesting that we not try to work out the precise language. This in substance is what we are talking about.

MR. GENTRY: The other change in Section 4 is the addition --

THE CHAIRMAN: Did anybody have anything else they wanted to add to this question of mental incompetency before we leave that?

(There was no response.)

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry.

MR. GENTRY: The final sentence in Section 4, any person excluding from voting for conviction of a crime; that is new language. Not hearing any comments, I assume that takes care of the objection at the last meeting.

MR. SCANLAN: Couldn't the Legislature do that? You said the General Assembly may by law exclude from voting those persons convicted of serious crimes. Wouldn't the grant of that power convey also the thought that they would have the power to restore a person's voting rights once they had been pardoned or do you
