fellows. Have to get along with these fellows. Is that all right?

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette.

DR. BURDETTE: I don't have my mind made up on the question but I would present an issue not mentioned here and I don't have the answer to it. We are debating the question whether people can better be represented by a county-wide slate or something less. In Baltimore City we answered it by saying that they can better be represented by something less than a city-wide slate.

One of the problems involved here is the acquaintance with persons. I have a feeling that citizens of Maryland in a county of 500,000 people it is easy to get up a slate. While I might happen to know them if they live in different parts of the county, I don't know them well, but if they came from my section of the county, I would be likely to know them better. This question has to be faced as to whether or not the citizenry would have access to the delegates which is somewhat the neighborhood arrangement. I don't
