THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

Questions? Does anybody know offhand -- I was trying
to see if I could find the answer, I don't know it -whether the present constitution, Article 3, dealing
with the Legislative Department, undertakes to say
the vote by which the Legislature shall pass legislation?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Mr. Chairman, there are rules that are part of the House of Delegates and Schate which they adopted.

THE CHAIRMAN: I know about the rules but
I am speaking of the constitution.

MR. BROOKS: There is a constitutional provision requiring majority vote on substantive matters by majority of those members of the Legislature if that is what you are referring to. That is in the constitution called the constitutional majority.

MR. SAYRE: As distinguished from present and voting.

MR. BROOKS: That is right.

MR. MARTINEAU: Section 28.

MR. BROOKS: States generally split on this,
