about 50-50, to have this requirement of the Legislature.

It is a rather awkward requirement in that it means
there can be no abstentions when you have such a rule.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

MR. MILLER: Question.

THE CHAIRMAN: The question is on the approval of the Fifth Recommendation which is that the enabling act provide that the convention on substantive matters shall act by majority vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye, contrary no. The ayes have it. So ordered. Sixth Recommendation.

MR. SCANLAN: The Sixth Recommendation,
Mr. Chairman, deals with the problem of authorizing the
convention to employ a staff. I think it is perfectly
obvious in order to have a successful convention you
have to have a competent staff. Many of the staff
personnel, of course, could and would be state employees
temporarily borrowed from other agencies of the Government such as for instance the Legislatuve Reference
Service. Perhaps the Comptroller's Office and Attorney
General's office, and so forth.

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
