until April 1, 1963. By that time a terrible squabble broke out on several fronts, especially the one between business and labor on the tax situation and the reapportionment situation.

As a consequence, it almost resulted in the defeat of an otherwise meritorious and modern state constitution, it carried by 7000 votes out of 1.6 million cast. We think one of the reasons was the inordinately long period of time in which this debate got steamed up, got quite bitter, and jeopardized the new constitution.

Balancing the need on the one hand for permitting the public to become acquainted with the recommendations of the convention, and indeed having good debate about them in the various civic groups, et cetera, against the hazard that the period of time could be too long, we recommend that the special election be held in which the proposed constitution would be submitted to the voters that this be not less than 90 days. In other words, that there would be at least 90 days of public discussion. Not less than 90 days after the
