some need for coordination of legislation with the new constitution, and adopting it in May would enable us to know in the state before the session of the Legislature the following January more effectively than if adopted in September. This is another strong argument that comes to my mind but I do confess reluctance to have a \$750,000 bill that might be avoided.

MR. SCANLAN: The Legislature can avoid it, just switch the primary back.

DR. BURDETTE: That raises the question whether we are urging the Legislature to switch the primary back.

MR. SCANLAN: I don't like to squander \$750,000.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further question? The question arises on the approval of the Eighth Recommendation that the vote on the proposed constitution be made not earlier than 90 days after adjournment of the convention, as soon thereafter as practical. Those in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. Ayes have it. Thank you, Mr. Scanlan.
