

1 first phrase, and of course, I am sure the Commission  
2 would agree that the court should consider, or should  
3 continue to pass on the sufficiency of the evidence, but  
4 that the Constitution should make no reference to any of  
5 this.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any discussion?

7 MR. MILLER: A question, Mr. Chairman. Does  
8 this mean that the criminal law and the civil law would  
9 be the same?

10 THE CHAIRMAN: As to the relative roles of the  
11 court and jury, that is correct.

12 MR. HARGROVE: Question.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: All those in favor of the  
14 motion, the deletion of this provision, or rather not in-  
15 cluding such provision in the new Constitution, so indicate  
16 by voting Aye; contrary-minded, No. Unanimously approved.
