statewide system of free public schools sufficient for
the education of, and open to, all children of school
age; and shall also provide for such other public educational institutions as may be desirable for the intellectual, cultural and occupational development of the citizens
of this State.

Now, that is Section 1, without some of the dated provisions of the Section 1 now in the Constitution. It has something of the same purport. We have, in the first clause of that Section 1, said pretty much what the old Section 1 said, and then we have added that the State shall also provide for such other public educational institutions.

Our purpose in so doing is to give recognition

to the fact that the public school system no longer consists merely of the grade schools that were known in 1867, but that the State supports a number of other educational facilities in addition, and that this should be given constitutional recognition.
