MR. SCANLAN: I was going to say, as Mrs. Bothe 1 said, this is largely an exhortatory section of the Con-2 stitution and while exhortatory, I don't believe we have 3 to have three sections for the State to do its duty in the 4 field of education. Leaving aside Section 3, to which I 5 will object on another ground, and taking Sections 1. 2. 6 and 4, which propose an amendment to which all of this 7 exhortation could be compressed in one section, reading as 8 follows, basic to what you have here: The General Assembly 9 shall provide for a statewide system of free public 10 schools, sufficient for the education of, and open to all 11 children of school age, and here would be my first part 12 of the amendment, Without regard to race, creed, color or 13 national origin, and shall also provide for such other 14 public educational institutions, and here would be the 15 second portion of my amendment, Including institutions of 16 higher learning, of higher education, and then the rest of 17 Section 1 remains as it is. I would delete Sections 2 and 18 4. 19 MRS. BOTHE: I might say the Committee spent a
