

1 reasons for it. Can we have a discussion of that point
2 and then the other would follow from it? Dr. Bard?

3 DR. BARD: I would like to support Mrs. Bothe
4 for a number of reasons, first because the early sections
5 that appeared in the Constitution dealt largely with the
6 concept of elementary and secondary education, and I
7 think it ought to be made clear that this addition in
8 higher education is something new. Then, too, the way our
9 higher educational institutions operate, they are not
10 free, certainly, totally, and to put them completely to-
11 gether would create some problems.

12 Now, I have some amendments that I want to
13 make in relation to Sections 2 and 3, but I merely at this
14 point support the concept of separateness for the higher
15 educational institutions.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: I had a more fundamental question
17 I would like to ask Mrs. Bothe, and I thought this was
18 behind the separation, but she didn't mention it. Is it
19 contemplated by your Section 2 that the General Assembly
20 shall provide a complete system of higher education, or
21 is it rather merely intended to indicate that the General
