2 wedded to this, but we are wedded to the principles that  
3 are embodied here.

4 MR. CASE: May I ask a question here?

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case.

6 MR. CASE: What difference does it make whether  
7 the admonition to the General Assembly is in the same  
8 section or in a different section, so long as the meat  
9 of it is there?

10 MRS. BOTHE: We are not saying it does make a  
11 difference. A lot of this is constitutional drafting,  
12 whether you make separate sections, whether you make  
13 separate paragraphs, and we struggled quite a bit over  
14 this. We didn't want to come to the Commission without  
15 a concrete proposal. We thought it was the best we could  
16 come up with. I suggested perhaps the Committee on Style  
17 might be the proper place to determine whether it should  
18 be separate sections, just as we are not making a recom-  
19 mendation as to whether it should be a separate article.
