THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Jenkins?

DR. JENKINS: I agree with Mr. Scanlan and Mr. Case that it doesn't make a lot of difference. It seems to me that Mr. Scanlon's suggestion simply tightens the situation, tightens the language, and it still constitutes a directive, a constitutional directive.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there anything further?

Mr. Melvin?

MR. MELVIN: I am not real clear on what the intent is. As I understand it, the Committee wants to require the Legislature to have, to maintain and continue the present system of public schools on at least through the high school years. Do you also wish to require the Legislature to adopt a full-scale system on the same scale for higher education?

MRS. BOTHE: We don't expect the Legislature to be directed to do anything beyond what it is presently doing, unless it so determines. There is a system of higher education maintained by the State as it is. We are including it in the Constitution, or proposing it be included here, on the basis of recognition of institu-
