

1 MRS. BOTHE: Not at all, sir. As a matter of
2 fact, these provisions exist in most state constitutions.
3 There is provision for higher education.

4 MR. CASE: Is there any authority where such
5 provision exists, which says that the school administra-
6 tors, whether they be the University of Maryland or
7 State colleges have the right to select whom they think
8 are qualified to attend?

9 MRS. BOTHE: Yes. There is nothing precluding
10 it. It merely establishes a system of higher education,
11 but nothing would preclude the powers that be from deter-
12 mining who will enjoy it, providing they didn't dis-
13 criminate.

14 DR. JENKINS: Under the present Constitution,
15 the institutions may set their own entrance requirements.

16 MR. CASE: There is nothing in the Constitution
17 about it.

18 MRS. BOTHE: Yes, there is.

19 MR. CASE: Where is it?

20 MRS. BOTHE: Not higher education but about
21 requirements.
