MRS. BOTHE: Not at all, sir. As a matter of fact, these provisions exist in most state constitutions.

There is provision for higher education.

MR. CASE: Is there any authority where such provision exists, which says that the school administrators, whether they be the University of Maryland or State colleges have the right to select whom they think are qualified to attend?

MRS. BOTHE: Yes. There is nothing precluding it. It merely establishes a system of higher education, but nothing would preclude the powers that be from determining who will enjoy it, providing they didn't discriminate.

DR. JENKINS: Under the present Constitution, the institutions may set their own entrance requirements.

MR. CASE: There is nothing in the Constitution
