

1 THE CHAIRMAN: We can't get a record when we
2 have the crosstalk this way.

3 MRS. BOTHE: Right now with the present pro-
4 vision that the General Assembly shall establish through-
5 out the State a thorough and efficient system of free
6 public schools, there is no preclusion on school authorities
7 to decide what children attend what schools or for what
8 reasons.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Templeton has the floor.

10 DR. TEMPLETON: I would like permission to hear
11 once again the draft that Mr. Scanlan read, I think
12 transposing somewhere further down the line of discrimina-
13 tion clause.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Could I restate it instead of
15 having him do that, because he said that he would have to
16 amend his draft. What he is suggesting is that the sub-
17 stance of Sections 2 and 4 be included in Section 1, with
18 the understanding that the Section 4 limitation be clearly
19 applied to both parts of Section 1, is that correct?

20 MR. SCANLAN: That is right.
