

1 MRS. FREEDIANDER: This includes adult educa-
2 tion. The second section refers to adult education pro-
3 grams, on going programs within our public education and
4 institutions without being institutions of higher learn-
5 ing. There is a distinction there.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond?

7 MR. BOND: I might point out in Section 1, you
8 have mandatory provision for children of school age, and
9 then you talk about other institutions, quote, As may be
10 desirable. Yet that language is left out in Section 2.
11 Therefore, I share the fears of Mr. Case, that it could
12 become a mandatory requirement to educate all children
13 in higher education.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry?

15 MR. GENTRY: Again, Section 2 is completely
16 silent as to scope. It leaves it completely in the dis-
17 cretion of the General Assembly to provide for it in any
18 scope, breadth, limitation, with or without limitation as
19 the Legislature sees fit.

20 MR. BOND: I don't agree with you.
