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Legislature.

MR. CASE: Not necessarily.

MR. BOND: My point is why don't they say the General Assembly shall provide as may be deemed desirable, as may be desirable, which they have used in the second part of Section 1?

THE CHAIRMAN: It seems to me the discussion is getting away from the motion. The motion is merely a matter of drafting the three sections so as to include in Section 1 the substance of Sections 2 and 4. Let's decide that first, and then we can go on from there. Dr. Bard?

DR. BARD: I don't think this statement is merely for the purpose of exhortation. It sets forth the concept of support. In Section 1, support is clear. It is mandated and in terms of full support. In Section 2, it makes it clear that the General Assembly shall provide I, myself, would take out the word, maintain, because some could believe that this would mean full support for higher education. That is not true now and isn't likely to come to Maryland.
