There is a good deal of debate in the field of higher education in Maryland in respect to establishing a system, clarified system, and I think Section 2 would give support to the concept of establishing a system, which our State is now involved in, but I do like the idea of separation, because I think one implies full financial support, as his true for the elementary and secondary schools and the higher education does not need that kind of support.

MRS. BOTHE: Before any vote is taken, I would implore the group not to tie the Commission to tying these sections all up, because our Committee has struggled so long and hard with the very same problem that Al Scanlan recognized immediately, that I would hate to see this thing bound by a motion of the Commission. The Committee is perfectly willing to work with the Committee on Style. We understand the problem, and we sympathize with it. We tried to lick it, and we haven't. I would feel that we are going to be back here arguing it all over again at a later point.

MR. CASE: Isn't it purely a question of style?
