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MRS. BOTHE: I think it is.

MR. CASE: I do, too.

THE CHAIRMAN: There is a motion.

MR. CASE: I would make a substitute motion that the matter be approved in substance subject to working out the way it is all put together by the Committee on Style, working in cooperation with the Miscellaneous Provisions Committee.

THE CHAIRMAN: Do you accept that, Mr. Scanlan?

MR. SCANLAN: Yes.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Second.

THE CHAIRMAN: What is the Committee's reaction?

MRS. BOTHE: All right.

THE CHAIRMAN: If there is no objection, it will be so ordered. No objection.

MR. CASE: Before we go further, it seems to me we overlooked the first recommendation of the Committee, which io, just before the italicized paragraph, the Committee recommends that Article 8 and Section 43 be eliminated, period. And I suggest that the last sentence
