1 THE CHAIRMAN: In line with that reasoning, 2 isn't it true that all preliminary votes in the Legis-. lature are by simple majority, that is, other than 3 third reading and final passage? 5 MR. CASE: I think so. 6 MR. MELVIN: Not on a bill. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Each reading has a majority? 8 MR. MELVIN: The final reading. THE CHAIRMAN: Just the final reading? 10 MR. MELVIN: Yes. 11 THE CHAIRMAN: First and second reading is 12 by a simple majority of those present? 13 MR. MELVIN: Yes. MR. ADKINS: I would join Mr. Melvin in this 15 discussion. It seems to me if we permit major changes 16 of a controversial nature such as described in this 17 constitution to be adopted by what could be 25 per 18 cent plus one vote, we are leaving the matter open for 19 substantial fights subsequent to the convention itself, 20 and adding weight to those people who might want to 21

oppose the constitution on that very ground. I think it
