8 of people here around this table, and I have the greatest
9 respect for those opinions.

10 MR. MILLER: Second the motion.

11 MR. CASE: It still seems to me this point
12 ought to be determined through basic research and not just
13 what we think sitting around this table.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard?

15 DR. BARD: I would certainly agree with the
16 statement that was made. However, I do feel that it is
17 sort of a negative approach to the problem of education.
18 As an educator, I feel very strongly that the approach
19 that we want to take is to make certain that our higher
20 educational institutions are dedicated to fulfilling the
