THE CHAIRMAN: I don't use complete in quite that sense. What worries me is a system that would provide enough colleges throughout the State to be available for all college students, and I take it this means public colleges.

PRS, POTHER Me. Chairmon, it may be, and I. can't personally see where it would be subject to this construction, and I say this partly because we picked up most of this language from compilations of other constitutions which have been in effect, ... I don't think there --is any State in the Union where every child is entitled to higher education or where the State must maintain a statewide system of higher education, and yet many other State Constitutions do make or give constitutional recognition to a higher educational system. We just couldn't believe that we were running into the kind of terrors that Mr. Case envisages, after seeing on a practical working basis provisions of this kind in existence, and I thank more states than most.

MR. CASE: May I say in answer to that, it is
