

1 exactly what you said that is terrifying me. You say you
2 got this from other constitutions. Now, if for example,
3 you got this from California, and I don't know whether
4 you did or whether you didn't, the very thing that Mr.
5 Melvin and I are talking about would obtain, namely that
6 you would have to have, this would require a complete
7 system, and this is exactly why I said, Mr. Eney, that I
8 thought some useful purpose would be served by a kind of
9 research that ought to be accomplished by the reporter,
10 whoever else is supposed to do it for this Commission on
11 a thing of this kind. This is a big thing in the area
12 of higher education throughout the country, and you just
13 can't sit around throwing words around without having
14 some idea as to what they mean or what they are going to
15 mean. I don't know myself what this means.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Let's get a few principles
17 stated first. As I understand, Mrs. Bothe, it is not the
18 intention of the Committee to recommend language which
19 would require the General Assembly to provide a complete
20 statewide system of colleges throughout the State?

21 MRS. BOTHE: That is correct.
