

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander?

2 MRS. FREEDLANDER: I would like to make
3 another point. The providing for and maintaining a system
4 of higher education, the facts are, much of the money
5 today, that goes for Baltimore Junior College and other
6 junior colleges, under the Higher Education Act is
7 collected from Federal funds. A great deal of this money
8 statistically, we could bring this kind of statistic in
9 to show how much of this is coming into the State of
10 Maryland so that the fear which might have existed maybe a
11 decade ago, in my opinion, is no longer valid because we
12 do, we have to have a system by which to get these funds.
13 We have to set up arrangements that qualify us for the
14 Federal funds, is that not so?

15 DR. BARD: I would add this. Mr. Case should
16 know, students pay tuition of fees that are fairly high
17 in the State of Maryland. I am in favor of keeping
18 tuition fees, as one educator. I don't think you will
19 find in Maryland a desire to establish completely free
20 public higher educational institutions.
