THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: I would like to make another point. The providing for and maintaining a system of higher education, the facts are, much of the money today, that goes for Baltimore Junior College and other junior colleges, under the Higher Education Act is collected from Federal funds. A great deal of this money statistically, we could bring this kind of statistic in to show how much of this is coming into the State of Maryland so that the fear which might have existed maybe a decade ago, in my opinion, is no longer valid because we do, we have to have a system by which to get these funds. We have to set up arrangements that qualify us for the Federal funds, is that not so?

DR. BARD: I would add this. Mr. Case should know, students pay tuition of fees that are fairly high in the State of Maryland. I am in favor of keeping tuition fees, as one educator. I don't think you will find in Maryland a desire to establish completely free public higher educational institutions.
