by -- I am not trying to use precise language now -- encouragement or support, whatnot, for higher education in the State of Maryland, without imposing on the Legislature the requirement that it provide a complete system of higher education, sufficient for the higher education of everyone in Maryland; fourthly, that it is not intended that the higher education colleges be free; fifthly, that it is not intended that the control of those institutions of admission practices be removed, so that they are open to everyone.

Have I stated what is the consensus of opinion of the Commission, or is there any disagreement with any of those five propositions?

MRS. BOTHE: Just one, Mr. Eney, and that is, I think that the Committee felt that the provision, re, higher education, should provide for a system and that the system would not be all-pervasive and comprehensive, but we wanted to continue the concept that there be some kind of a system, just like there is an elementary school system.
