the delineation makes it clear that there is a distinction 1 between the non-public and the public higher educational 2 institutions, we are going to run into difficulty in 4 regard to enactments which are supported for one kind or 5 another. THE CHAIRMAN: I think we are talking a dif-6 7 ference of words, really. I believe everybody is in Is there any dissent from these propositions as 8 9 they have been outlines? If not, I would suggest, Mrs. Bothe, that Mr. Case's suggestion is in order and that the 10 11 Committee reconsider these sections in the light of the comments, at least of the worries and fears expressed, and 12 to carry out the five or six principles on which the Com-13 mission seems to be in accord. 14 15 MRS. BOTHE: We will do that if that is what 16 the Commission desires. 17 THE CHAIRMAN: Let's move then to Section 3. Section 3 provides, and this proposal 18 MRS. BOTHE: is for an entirely new section in the new Maryland Con-19 20 stitution. We propose a Section 3 which would read,

The University of Maryland shall be the State university
