2       officers of the State, as Mrs. Bothe has pointed out, it  
3       should be clearly understood that this does not apply to  
4       appropriation, but only to expenditures, and that all  
5       expenditures are subject to post-audit. It is our exper-  
6       ience in higher education that very important decisions  
7       affecting educational programs are not made by the Budget  
8       Bureau, and particularly young budget analysts. For-  
9       tunately, we have not in the twenty years I have been at  
10      Morgan State, and as far as I know this applies to other  
11      institutions, we have noted undue political pressure from  
12      either the governor or the General Assembly, although  
13      this would be a protection in the event that occurred.

14                I have two amendments to propose, however.  
15      You may wish to take them separately.

16                I think and will move that the phrase shall be  
17      the State University, be deleted. I don't think it is the  
18      intention of the Committee to make the decision that in  
19      the future in Maryland there shall be only one State  
20      university. Now, at this point in history there is one  
21      State university, and there probably should not be any
