ference, undue interference by political or administrative officers of the State, as Mrs. Bothe has pointed out, it should be clearly understood that this does not apply to appropriation, but only to expenditures, and that all expenditures are subject to post-audit. It is our experience in higher education that very important decisions affecting educational programs are not made by the Budget Bureau, and particularly young budget analysts. Fortunately, we have not in the twenty years I have been at Morgan State, and as far as I know this applies to other institutions, we have noted undue political pressure from either the governor or the General Assembly, although this would be a protection in the event that occurred.

I have two amendments to propose, however.

You may wish to take them separately.

I think and will move that the phrase shall be the State University, be deleted. I don't think it is the intention of the Committee to make the decision that in the future in Maryland there shall be only one State university. Now, at this point in history there is one State university, and there probably should not be any
