more. However, our population is increasing rapidly. The General Assembly may decide later that there should be other universities, maybe one on the Eastern Shore, some other place, and I don't think that we should have a constitutional prohibition, nor do I think we should have a constitutional statement which would mean that any other university must be a part of the University of Maryland, and so I propose that the statement read, The University of Maryland shall be governed, et cetera, and leave this question of whether it should be the University twenty-five years in the future to commissions and to the legislative process.

My second amendment would be one to include the State, other State colleges. The Committee points out that these colleges are small, in justification of excluding them; that the other institutions are small. I hope the implication was not that they are unimportant, because there are those who love them, and that they want to get away from naming institutions. I certainly agree with that. However, when we consider the total population served by these institutions now and in the future,
