

1 this holds true for the University of Maryland. I, for  
2 one, would keep this in for the University of Maryland,  
3 but do the same for the State colleges.

4 As for the junior colleges, I believe the  
5 statement ought to differ some because their funds come  
6 from local political units, as well as from the State, and  
7 to have a parallel statement for the community colleges  
8 would be wrong in that we would freeze a State system of  
9 community colleges on the State of Maryland at this point  
10 when there is no readiness for it.

11 MR. SAYRE: You don't need it in the Constitu-  
12 tion, do you?

13 DR. BARD: The only thing I think you would need,  
14 and I have felt all along, that I like the idea of a  
15 separate section on higher education, and the rationale for  
16 it is given in this paper. I would divide that separate  
17 section so that you have a subsection on the University  
18 of Maryland, another subsection on State colleges, and a  
19 mere statement that might be exhortation in regard to the  
20 significance of the community colleges and the importance  
21 of State aid in terms of the higher educational system,
