have to shut off this debate in the next three minutes, because we need at least fifteen minutes to discuss some things we have got to discuss before we adjourn. I doubt very much the way the discussion is going now that it could be satisfactorily concluded in two or three minutes.

MR. CASE: May I make a statement?

THE CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

MR. CASE: Well, I am prepared to speak in defense of this particular provision for at least a half an hour, if necessary. I am being a little facetious when I say that, but I think this is an extremely important provision, certainly to the people who are associated with the University of Maryland, one which requires a great deal of study in depth, and I think that the members of this Commission certainly voting on it deserve to hear all sides of the controversy. There are many, many points here which should be made in connection with why President Elkins thinks this is a very necessary provision in our State Constitution.

It just seems to me the hour being what it is, we are all, certainly I will speak for myself, suffering
